TO: Commanding Officer, 3rd Platoon, 232nd Ordnance Company  
(Bomb Disposal)

1. Attention is invited to basic communication  
and to War Department Memorandum W30-12-43, dated 27 March  
1943, a copy of which is attached.

2. Your organization will be responsible for com-  
plying with the provisions of this memorandum, insofar as it  
pertains to Artillery impact and Bombing ranges in this  
District. This work will be coordinated through the District  
S-3, who will furnish this office with firing schedules so  
that recovery operations will not interfere with unit training  
schedules. Liaison with the Air Corps in connection with re-  
covery operation on their Bombing Range will be made directly  
by you.

3. Projectiles and fragments which are recovered  
will be placed in drums which you will obtain from the Salvage  
Officer of the Quartermaster Depot. These drums, after being  
filled, will be turned in to the Salvage Officer for disposition.

4. The report required in paragraph 3 of the basic  
communication will be prepared by you and submitted to this  
office.
